

### **POLICY** and Legislation

Safer TN achieved a major milestone by helping pass the first legislation in nearly a decade that limits firearm access for Tennesseans deemed mentally incompetent or adjudicated for violent juvenile offenses. At the State Capitol, we engaged Governor Bill Lee and lawmakers in meaningful conversations on community safety, mobilized over 250 volunteers from 13 counties to meet with legislators, and successfully blocked a dangerous open carry policy for loaded long guns in public spaces.

Incentivize secure storage and background checks.


- Explore ways to strengthen and better enforce existing laws, including improving the firearm dispossession process in our domestic violence laws.
- Continue and expand on Tennessee's public service announcement campaign to promote secure firearm storage.
- Work to obtain better data on firearm injuries in Tennessee to find evidence-based, homegrown solutions.





### **COALITION Growth**

In 2024, Safer TN expanded to nearly 30,000 members across all 95 counties. We launched a community presence initiative to connect with Tennesseans at local events through representatives, speaker trainings, presentations, and collaborations with grassroots volunteers and organizations. These efforts ignited meaningful conversations about firearm safety and motivated individuals to take action.
