We are a nonpartisan, nonprofit organization committed to advancing firearm safety policies and programs that protect our communities and respect the Second Amendment. VOICES FOR A SAFER TENNESSEE

Dear Safer TN supporters,

Thanks to your generosity and collaboration, we closed 2025 – our second full operational year – with **momentum and meaningful progress toward a safer Tennessee.**

The signs of change are encouraging. We saw a **decline in firearm tragedies** in 2024 (latest data available) compared to 2023's record high. Recent polling among Republican primary voters also shows **growing support for our policy priorities**, reflecting a shift toward safer practices statewide. **Engagement grew** across all 95 counties, with a 33% increase in event participation. **We are meeting this demand** by adding staff from West to East Tennessee.

Significant challenges remain. Tennessee continues to top several lists we would rather not lead including firearm thefts from vehicles, accidental shootings involving children, and firearm homicides and suicides. **Even so, we are encouraged by the shared commitment of policymakers as well as business, civic, and faith leaders working together to drive meaningful change.**

This report highlights our progress and outlines our path forward as two coordinated arms – a 501(c)(3) dedicated to education and outreach and a 501(c)(4) focused on advocacy and policy – working toward one shared mission that strengthens and broadens our impact.

We could not have achieved this progress – or look ahead with such determination – without you. Your time, generosity, and commitment are foundational to our work. We hope this report leaves you energized to continue this journey with us as we expand our impact in the year ahead.

Advocating for Policy Change

In 2025, Safer TN successfully advocated for several firearm safety laws now signed into law. We also provided data to oppose bills that would have weakened safety, including a proposal to allow long guns in public spaces that ultimately failed. These accomplishments reflect collaboration with Gov. Bill Lee, leaders in the Tennessee General Assembly, and dedicated volunteers who met with lawmakers, attended committee hearings, and helped host events.



NEW LAWS ENACTED

- ✓ **Ban on Glock switches**, which convert handguns to fully automatic weapons
- ✓ **People convicted of felonies now prohibited** from possessing ammunition
- ✓ **Stronger sentencing** for those convicted of a drive-by shooting



STOPPED BILLS THAT WOULD HAVE

- ✗ Allowed open carry of loaded long guns in public
- ✗ Permitted open carry in schools and posted places such as churches and businesses
- ✗ Lowered the age for permitless carry to 18

What's Next in Policy:

- Continue collaborating with policymakers
- Serve as a trusted partner to law enforcement, healthcare, and other local leaders
- Amplify research and data that can lead to policy, including a data dashboard with University of Tennessee, Knoxville that shows county-level firearm injuries, death rates, and economic impact

Growing Supporters Across Tennessee

From Mountain City to Memphis, we've grown to nearly 35,000 supporters. One-on-one conversations, small group meetings, large speaking events, and community gatherings are leading to new support every day. We partner with small businesses, healthcare organizations, first responders, and determined parents and grandparents working to build a generational culture of safety.






In 2025, we saw increased investment in our work from a diverse group of Tennesseans: individuals, families, organizations, and businesses alike. Their generosity allowed us to expand our staff to meet rising demand and grow our visibility across the state.

Key Accomplishments

- ★ **501(c)(3):** \$1,040,000 total raised, a **30% increase** from 2024
- ★ **501(c)(4):** \$181,000 total raised
- ★ **1,400 donors** representing 40 counties
- ★ \$75,000 raised through **grassroots fundraising gatherings**
- ★ \$150,000 raised in 3 days through **digital campaigns**


